Skinner Recommendations

The Hamilton Public Health Services, Hamilton Police Services, the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board and the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board hosted a free event to launch parent resources developed in response to recommendations from the inquest into the 2010 alcohol poisoning death of a local youth, Christopher Skinner. Numeracy Task Force

The decline in student achievement in mathematics is evident both locally and provincially. In response to this ongoing concern with mathematics achievement the Board is establishing a task force comprised of current and former mathematics experts including teachers, administrators, retired teachers and retired administrators. The task force will examine mathematics education in the Board and provide recommendations to both the Board and the Ministry of Education in finding the most successful practices that support student achievement in mathematics.
